PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

In this issue, and in future newsletters, Rudy Becker, President of Our/Your Board of Trustees will give a monthly overall report on the status of the Cemetery

Your Board of Trustees continues to focus on capital improvements at the Cemetery. Those include the gatehouse roof replacement, repair of exterior wood trim and interior ceiling repair due to water leakage, repointing of stone walls along Lincoln Road, V Street, North Capitol Street and along roadways on Cemetery grounds, and uprighting of fallen tombstones. Combined estimated cost for these is \$80,000. We hope to develop a plan of attack over the next several months. If anyone has suggestions on resolution of these issues, please let us know. (See related story on Page 6.)

The neighborhood adjacent to the Cemetery is undergoing considerable revitalization, particularly on the west side of North Capitol Street. Our new superintendent, Joe Connell, conceived an approach to increasing community involvement and exposure by opening the Cemetery grounds to the new people moving into the area. He has removed the "No Trespassing" signs and keeps the Cemetery gates open during daylight hours on most days.

As a result, he has noticed an increase in the number of people, mostly young professionals, taking advantage of the bucolic environment the Cemetery grounds provide. Joe feels that well-groomed grounds will encourage visitor enjoyment and discourage misuse. Anyone who visits the Cemetery will notice how well-kept it is due to Joe's efforts. We encourage lot owners to visit often.

MEET OUR NEW SUPERINTENDENT JOE CONNELL

He loves our Cemetery and enjoys keeping it in good shape. That's what our new superintendent, Joseph "Joe" Connell, says. And from the well-kept appearance of our Cemetery grounds he means it.

Joe has been working at Prospect Hill full time since October 2006. His duties include overseeing burials, maintaining the grounds, and providing security for the Cemetery. Landscaping is nothing new to Joe. He held several such jobs during the summers while attending George Mason University.

Joe is of German-Irish descent. He enjoys reading history and being involved with music in his free time.

Joe is delighted to be at Prospect Hill and looks forward to meeting you when you come by to visit.

Prospect Hill's trustees are convinced their choice of Joe Connell was the right decision. He has already proved it by arranging and supervising four burials, sawing up and disposing of another fallen tree, repairing a lawn mower and continuing to keep our historic Cemetery looking beautiful.

Joe's March report to the Board of Trustees included the following: shoveled snow; bought electric hedge trimmer and trimmed juniper bushes in front of gatehouse; removed fallen tree with chainsaw in the back circle where the chapel once stood; answered correspondence; picked up and removed fallen branches and trimmed the tree limbs.

Also filled with gravel a pothole by the tool shed; cleaned tool shed and storage shed; primed and painted metal wastebaskets outside; took inventory of fallen stones; contacted backhoe representative about setting stones and grading corner of section D and removing fallen statues and concrete; called a lawn and power company to pick up mowers, give them a tune-up and replace blades and tires.

CEMETERY GATEHOUSE ROOF AND CEILINGS PLUS ALL STONE WALLS ARE IN NEED OF REPAIR

Expenses continue to pile up in our 149-year old Cemetery.

The clay tile roof of the 80-year old gatehouse needs extensive work — repair broken tiles, re-anchor displaced tiles, re-seal tiles, and repaint the entire roof to achieve a uniform appearance.

The defects on the roof have created a leakage in the ceilings of the upstairs bedrooms of the gatehouse. This also needs to be repaired and repainted.

The stone walls surrounding the Cemetery are also showing their age. Some mortar joints in the large walls on Lincoln Road, V Street and North Capitol Street are deteriorating. And several stones need to be replaced.

Also, several feet of the retaining stone wall inside the Cemetery, on the hill after entering, have to be repaired, reset or replaced.

Your Board of Trustees is considering several proposals from area construction and roofing firms and will make a decision soon. These projects will cost thousands of dollars.

Since Prospect Hill Cemetery has been named a DC Historic Landmark by the DC Historic Preservation Board any repairs or remodeling must sharply resemble features of the original structure. That's why a different type roof cannot be applied.

PROSPECT HILL HAS FOUR BURIALS IN LATE 2006

In the last two months of 2006, four persons associated with Prospect Hill were laid to rest. In November Madge Bertram and Martha Latterner were buried. Emma Ida Dauber and Karl Gabsch were interred in December.

Our sympathy is extended to members of the families of these four persons.
