TREASURER'S REPORT

Thanks to your most generous support during 2012, including income from donations, bequests, burials, lot sales, publications sales, and ever increasing returns on our investment portfolio. Total revenues were \$156,600. Expenses were \$165,100 leaving a deficit of \$8,500. Major capital expenditures in 2012 included the Gatehouse Roof Replacement and Building Painting Projects.

ALL ARE INVITED TO HELP ON CLEAN UP DAY AT THE CEMETERY ON MAY 18

Spring has sprung! And it's time for some spring cleaning at our Prospect Hill Cemetery. Superintendent Joe Connell says there is plenty to do, but he also says he could use a little help.

Your Board of Trustees has designated Saturday, May 18, at 10:00 a.m. as our fourth annual Clean Up day to make sure our historic cemetery will look it's best for our annual lot owners' meeting and memorial service on Memorial Day, May 27.

So get out your rakes, brooms, clippers, weed wackers, old shoes, work clothes and gloves in preparation for the big Memorial Day weekend when many relatives and friends of those buried here visit and decorate the graves of their loved ones.

Best of all, refreshments will be available to the volunteers when the work is done. In case of inclement weather, call the cemetery office for a decision on canceling the program.

THREE BURIALS PERFORMED AT PROSPECT HILL LAST YEAR

The response to our annual end-of-year Holiday Memorial Fundraiser campaign was most impressive. The list of donors proves that.

It also proves that when a serious financial situation arises we all get together to help. Such was our plea last year concerning the roof replacement on the old gatehouse. You came through wonderfully.

But more and more the financial burden for running our beautiful little cemetery and keeping its gatehouse in livable condition is falling on the generosity of our present generation of heirs, relatives and friends of those original lot owners buried here.

Why? It's obvious. While most cemeteries depend on burials and the sale of lots for much of their income, Prospect Hill does not. Only three burials were recorded at Prospect Hill last year. All of the burials were of cremation ashes, which costs considerably less than a full body burial.

Names of the deceased, ages and dates of their burials:

Bonnie Parkhurst, 94, June 2, 2012 (ashes)

Robert Seebold, 83, October 13, 2012 (ashes)

But don't think for one minute that Prospect Hill is sold out of burial sites. We're far from it. Hundreds of lots are still available. And at a price comparable, or less, to other cemeteries in the area.

FLAGS WILL FLY AGAIN OVER GRAVES OF U. S. MILITARY VETERANS

Memorial Day weekend is always an important time of the year to our United States military veterans buried at Prospect Hill.

That's when Superintendent Connell and members of your Board of Trustees place American flags on the veterans graves similar to the annual ritual performed at Arlington and all national cemeteries.

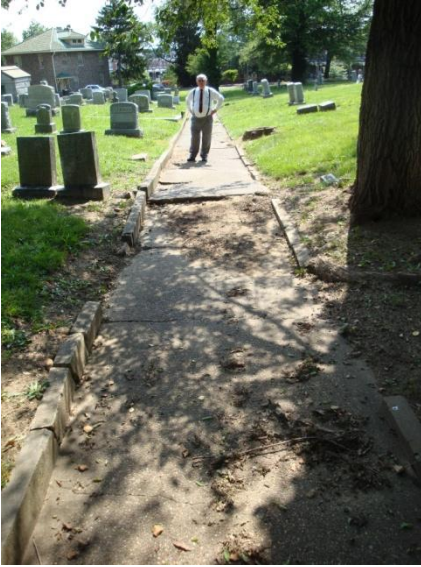

CEMETERY SIDEWALKS AND STEPS REPAIRED

Over the years, the sidewalk to the west and north of Section "E" had deteriorated to the extent that they were unsafe for visitors to the cemetery. As trees lining the sidewalks had grown ever larger, pavement sections in front of them had lifted, creating traps for debris and tripping points. In addition, the stairway at the north end of the west walkway was difficult to climb due to different step heights.

Thanks to generous donations from several lot owners, the cemetery engaged R & R Tree Experts of Silver Spring, MD, (Website: <http://randtree.com/>), to remove and replace the damaged sections of

walkway and rework the stairway. The results of the some of the work are shown below.

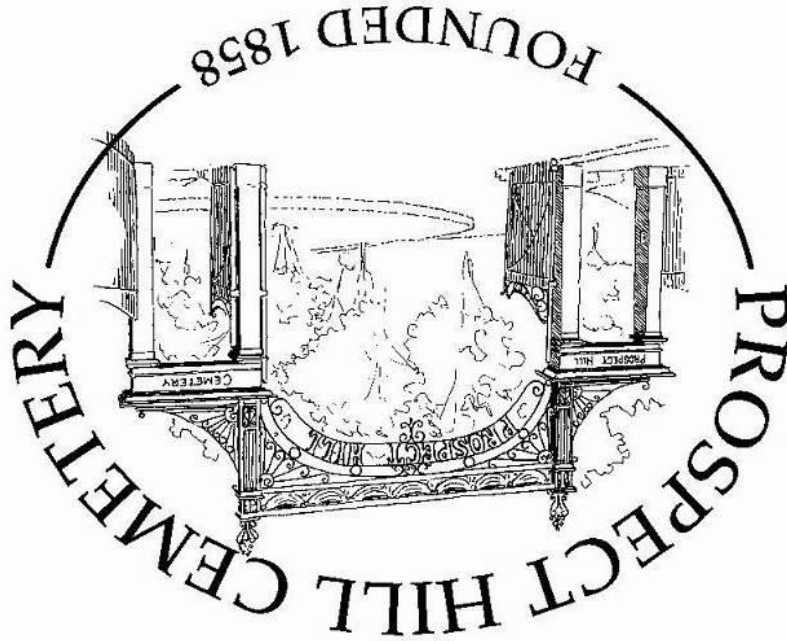
