If you do not wish to contribute a memorial donation please help us with an End-of-Year financial support donation, also indicated on the Order Form.



OTHER WAYS TO HONOR YOUR LOVED ONES

Another opportunity for you to honor your deceased loved ones and contribute to the upkeep of the cemetery is to transfer appreciated securities (stocks, bonds, etc.). You'll receive a federal tax deduction for the value of the security, and not have to pay a capital gains tax calculated on the original value of the security.

Still another way you can help ensure the future of our cemetery is to include it in your will (called a bequest). We have received several such bequests in the past and would welcome any in the future. It is best that a bequest is "unrestricted", so the cemetery can use the funds to fulfill any of its needs. Several bequests enabled replacement of the Gatehouse roof.

Consult your attorney for more information on how you can transfer your securities or honor our cemetery with a bequest. Your Board of Trustees appreciates any such contributions that will help secure the future of our historic Prospect Hill Cemetery.



CEMETERY PUBLICATIONS MAKE GREAT CHRISTMAS PRESENTS

Prospect Hill publications provide interesting and valuable information about people buried at the cemetery as well as historical information about how they contributed to the growth of Washington, DC, especially during its formative years. It is important for the future preservation of Prospect Hill that we inform our children and grandchildren about the cemetery so

that they may support it after we have departed.

Prospect Hill Cemetery Adult Burial List, compiled by president Carol Holler and our former cemetery historian the late Jean Crabill, may rouse your curiosity and make you want to know more. Nearly 300 pages, the book lists all burials of persons 14 years of age or older through year 2003. It has been a "best seller," having already been reprinted once, and is available for \$35 (plus \$5 postage).

Prospect Hill Cemetery Children's Burial List, a companion to the Adult Burial List, records all burials of persons younger than 14 years of age, and is available for \$20 plus \$5.

And if you'd like to read many interesting mini-biographies of persons interred in Prospect Hill, another book, *The Families of Prospect Hill*, is also available. Written in collaboration with about 160 lot owners and descendants, the book contains 496 pages with many photographs, and is priced at \$20 plus \$5.

Perhaps the most historic of Crabill's books about our cemetery is her first one, *The Immigrants and Their Cemetery: The Story of Prospect Hill*. This book contains the original history written around 1949 by Catholic University German Professor Dr. Paul Gleis (who worked from the original cemetery's Board minutes, written in German until about 1920), then from 1950 to the present time, and tells about the early German-American immigrant history in Washington, DC. It contains 194 pages and costs \$30 plus \$5. All books may be purchased by using the Order Form on page 7.

UPDATE ON THE WATER BILL ISSUE aka CRIAC

Good News!

The Clean Rivers Impervious Area Charge (CRIAC) for FY 2019 (Effective 10/1/2018) has been reduced to \$23.00 from \$25.18 in FY 2018. This will result in a \$1,650 savings. The rate will increase again in FY 2020 to 25.58.

More Good News!

DC Water and Sewer Authority (DCWASA) has developed an amendment to its Customer Assistance Program which will provide a significant one-year discount of 90 percent of the CRIAC fee for FY 2019 (October 1, 2018 thru September 31, 2019) to cemeteries and other non-profits. Organizations would need to provide proof of nonprofit status and demonstrate need by proving that the CRIAC fee is at least 0.75% of revenue after expenses. In addition, organizations would be required to install and maintain stormwater mitigation onsite or implement an alternative stormwater mitigation measure in the District. If the amendment is approved and Prospect Hill's request is approved, the savings for the one year would be about \$14,000.

CHANGING OF THE GUARD

Carol Holler has stepped down as President but will continue as a Trustee. Gerd Halusa has been elected as President.

Carol joined the board in 2000 as a trustee. She had been a volunteer supporter for several years before. She assisted former cemetery historian Jean Crabill in compiling the Adult and Children's Burial Lists, spending countless hours traversing the cemetery grounds visiting each grave to capture information not in the record books. She was elected president in 2001 and has served in that role ever since except for two years when she served as Treasurer. She led the search for a new superintendent in 2007, selecting Joseph Connell who was approved by the board. Joe has proven to be an excellent choice as evidenced by his dedication to the cemetery and the families of those buried there. The cemetery grounds have never looked better. During Carol's tenure, several major projects have been completed including replacement of the roof on the Stone House, replacement of crumbling concrete sidewalks, and renovation of the main bathroom in the Stone House among others. She reestablished the annual Clean Up Day and Memorial Day Service. We are thankful for her leadership over the last seventeen years.

Gerd Halusa has been a trustee on the Prospect Hill board since 2013. He has fulfilled the comptroller role as well occasional secretary. He has also served as comptroller and secretary on the boards of other non-profits in the Washington, DC area. We look forward to his leadership in the future.

A Message from Gerd

My name is Gerd Halusa. I was born in Germany, immigrated to the United States in 1964, and became aware of the Prospect Hill Cemetery when my wife attended the Memorial Day meetings singing with the Washington Saengerbund of which she was a member.

I have followed the events at the cemetery for years and finally became active in its operation as a board member. During this time Carol Holler was the president of the organization and has recently expressed the wish to step back from that responsibility but to remain as a board member.

Carol Holler has been the president of Prospect Hill Cemetery for many years and my impression during the time I have been able to observe her handling of the position was always positive. I hope I can be at least half as good in taking over from her.

Twenty-two people have responded so far to the survey, with the following results:

Comments

- Has anybody looked into “find a grave.com” to see if they offer this service. The system should be offsite, so anyone can locate a grave.
- Does the cemetery have the resources available for such a project – Ed.: We have received a grant which partially funds it and will ask for more.
- I use the Congressional Cemetery website a great deal. I would be happy to support the installation of this system. If there is a gap in money raised, please contact me.
- I have been doing genealogy research and this would be another great source. I was expecting a map, though, actually locating the grave. Not just Plot # and such. It looks similar to Find-a-Grave, but you could ensure that all graves are documented.
- I do not need it. However, it is excellent for those who do. I am in favor of getting it.
- How many calls does the Superintendent receive in a year” Can we afford this cost with water bills being so costly? I would like to know how we do this service now to make an informed response.
- Please, Please, Please Do Not do this! Save the money. Unless you can show profit two time the cost, it is not needed. We have almost no sales or new lot usage. Please, Please, Please!
- YES!! Besides myself, I know of 2 other cousins who have been trying to research our family there. It is very difficult getting any answers/responses from this cemetery!
- Seems too expensive for yearly fees to maintain it.
- I think the cemetery should purchase this system to keep up with the times.
- Probably should get it because we are a very old cemetery. However, I believe there are programs which can achieve the same results, at less cost.
- Without personal need I question the cost. Perhaps genealogical search-for-profit companies might pay all or part?

The board will consider these results and comments before making a final decision.
