
ALL ARE INVITED TO HELP ON CLEAN UP DAY AT THE CEMETERY SATURDAY, MAY 13, 2023

TREASURER'S REPORT

Inflows during 2022, including donations, bequests, grants, burials, lot sales, publications sales, and returns on our investment portfolio, were \$106,175. Outflows were \$113,837 leaving a deficit of (\$7,662.) The DC water bill decreased to \$4,500 as a result of a decrease in the CRIAC amount and a credit of \$10,700 from the CRIAC Non-profit Relief Program.

CRIAC fees are gradually being reduced and the CRIAC Non-profit Relief Program has been extended for the coming DC FY 2023. If our application is approved, we expect to receive a credit of about \$10,000.

ARTICLE FROM THE FAMILIES OF PROSPECT HILL by Jean Crabil

The John Angermann Family

John Angermann Dorothea Angermann

John Angermann was born in Prussia around 1820. In 1842 he immigrated to the United States, entering through the port of Baltimore and coming immediately to Washington, DC. It is not known when he married Dorothea, an immigrant from Hesse, born there around 1821, but by 1844 they had a son, George.

At the time of the 1860 census, John, a shoemaker, declared \$15,000 in real estate and \$2,000 in personal property, a large sum of money in those times. By then son George had two brothers, Theodore, 11, and John, 8, and a 13-year-old sister, Mathilda.

It is known that John fought in the Civil War, for there is a Civil War marker for him in the family plot. Unfortunately, the elements of nature have worn away its surface; only his name is now readable.

John was a designer and maker of shoes and boots. During and immediately after the Civil War his shop and home were at 505 7th Street in the northwestern sector of Washington, DC.

By the time the 1870 census was taken, John's family had grown to include sons George (who was not employed); Theodore, a pilot; and John, a cabinetmaker. A daughter, Amelia, 9, had been born shortly after the 1860 census. A daughter-in-law, Mary, 20, and her son, John, five months of age, lived with the family.

Financially John was doing very well indeed. With \$40,000 in real estate holdings and \$9,000 in personal property, in 1872 he was able to retire. For several years he and his family lived near Schuetzen Park. By 1879 they had moved to what later became Morrison Street, NW, at that time a rural area beyond the city limits in the far northwest corner of the District of Columbia.

John and Dorothea were members of the German Lutheran Church.

On April 29, 1894 Dorothea, 75, died of senile debility. John lived until July 6, 1908, when at age 88 he died of enteritis. His family remembers him as "an excellent and law-abiding citizen of refinement and good deeds."

Ernest LeMoure Angermann Catherine Reyburn Angermann

The son of John George and Dorothea Angermann, Ernest L. Angermann was born in Washington, DC, on April 25, 1889. He married Catherine Reyburn, a Marylander born around 1895.

Ernest & Catherine had two children, Dorothea was born on May 22, 1914. George arrived on February 8, 1917. Both children were born in California.

In 1910 Ernest, still living in his parents' home, was working as an electrician. Sometime between then and 1914, he and Catherine moved to California. They returned to Washington shortly after the birth of their son George and made their home at 36123 10th Street, NW.

At the time of the 1920 census, Ernest was employed as an electrical contractor. Living with his family was his mother-in-law, Adeline Reyburn, 61.


During the 1920s and the early 1930s, Ernest specialized in electrical appliances. By 1934 the family had moved to 1420 Harvard Street, NW, moving from there to 3C Ridge Road in suburban Greenbelt, Maryland. By 1942 they had returned to Washington and were living at 2400 16th Street, NW. At that time, Ernest was a Christian Science practitioner.

On August 29, 1969, Ernest, 80, died of a heart attack in Azusa, California. His daughter recalls, "He was the most wonderful Dad a child could have."
