LOT OWNERS MEETING, DEDICATION OF MEMORIAL GROVE HIGHLIGHT MEMORIAL DAY FESTIVITIES AT PROSPECT HILL

Memorial Day observance on Monday, May 31, 2010, will be another memorable day in the history of Prospect Hill Cemetery. And we invite all of you to join in.

Not only because it will be the day we hold our annual lot owners meeting but it will also be the day we dedicate our newly completed beautification project – Memorial Grove.

And because it is also a special day in the history of our country we will also hold a short Memorial Day service honoring deceased United States military veterans.

The lot owners meeting opens the festivities at 11 a.m. Followed by finger-food refreshments at approximately noon. After lunch, at about 1:00 p.m., the Memorial Day service will be conducted during which The Washington Saengerbund choral group will sing several favorite German hymns. The Memorial Grove dedication ceremony will conclude the day's activities.

If you plan to honor your deceased loved ones at Prospect Hill this Memorial Day by decorating their graves with flowers why not schedule your visit in time to join the festivities. All are welcome. Bring a friend. Meet your Board of Trustees members and other lot owners. Hope to see you there.

If it's a nice spring day all events will be held on the site of the old chapel at the top of the hill not far from the new Memorial Grove. If the weather is threatening we'll meet on the roadway by the gatehouse. If real bad weather occurs call the office, 202-667-0676, for the final decision.



ONLY SEVEN BURIALS PERFORMED, ONE LOT SOLD LAST YEAR

Once again, as in 2008, Superintendent Connell oversaw only seven burials at Prospect Hill last year. Also, as in 2008, four were cremations ashes burials, which require far less effort then full body burials and cost a lot less. Only one burial plot was sold. Four were sold in 2008.

FLAGS WILL AGAIN FLY OVER GRAVES OF U.S. MILITARY VETERANS

Memorial Day weekend is always an important time of the year at Prospect Hill Cemetery. That's when Superintendent Joe Connell and members of your Board of Trustees honor United States

military veterans buried in our cemetery by placing American flags on their graves similar to the annual ritual performed at Arlington and all national cemeteries.

Many veterans' gravestones, such as those from the Civil War, give information only about military service. Others, usually in family plots, do not.

To make certain we do not miss your ancestors or family members who served in the U. S. military, please fill out and mail the form on the last page of this newsletter indicating on whose grave(s) you would like flags placed. There is no charge for this service.


